Stuck in the Middle – tells the story of a high performing alpha-female daughter, torn between the rival needs of her divorced parents discovers that, like her mother, she too will develop early dementia in just 5 years. When she must decide if she'll save her father's family business by paying his \$100K debt or use that money to move her adversarial mother into an assisted living home, she struggles with old allegiances and if doing the right thing is all it's cracked up to be.

Blues Eye View - is the Black women of B-More 20 years after "The Wire", told from the POV of the children they bore. When Tamantha wins a coveted spot in an entrepreneur training program for underprivileged single moms, she and her fellow program moms, confront a city government that may be 20 years older, but still practices the same old bullshit: high on promises but low on everything that matters. Week to week, we witness the dogged determination of Tamantha and her rag-tag crew of mom's hell bent on creating a new family paradigm inspired by hope.

New play: *The Race Card*- When Cheryl, a Black woman professor teaching at a PWI is denied tenure by her all-white review panel, she resolves to get her denial overturned.
