Her research interest and expertise are in neurologically based communication disorders with adolescents and adults and primarily focus on traumatic brain injury/sport-related concussion.

Davis directs the Cognitive-Communicative Skills Clinic and Research Lab (CCC Skills) in which the team examines cognitive-communicative deficits associated with sport-related concussion and return-to-learn/play/activity for student-athletes following concussion. She is the inaugural Chair of the Committee on Race, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion in the Academy of Neurologic Communication Disorders and Sciences. Lastly, Davis conducts webinars and trainings on brain injury and hosts the podcast, "Life, Language, & Lyrics."
