

Shahriar Shafiani, Ph.D., MFA is an assistant professor of film at the Cathy Hughes School of Communications, Department of Media, Journalism, and Film, where he is also the coordinator of the graduate film program. He is an award-winning filmmaker, scholar, and educator who specializes in Film Directing and Editing.

Alongside his academic work, Shafiani continues to direct, edit, and coach performers for film and television. Originally from Iran, he began his career as an independent filmmaker in the Middle East before moving to the United States to pursue graduate study.
