

Denise W. Streeter, Ph.D. is an associate professor in the Department of Finance and Accounting at the Howard University School of Business. She returned to Howard, her alma mater, in 2015 after serving on the faculty at The Pennsylvania State University's York and World Campuses; and working as EVP/Chief Financial Officer (CFO) at National 4-H Council; as well as at national/local public accounting firms. She has earned degrees in accounting (HU, magna cum laude), economics (M.A.), and finance (M.S. and PhD) and has taught students of all ages, in various formats, at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, and on three continents.

Streeter earned tenure at Howard in 2022 and was recognized as a Faculty Scholar (2021), an Alumni Exemplar of the Howard University School of Business (2015), and Outstanding Woman of 4-H (2007). She is listed in Who's Who among Black Americans (1991) for her layperson research on the First 100 Black CPAs. She has published research in accounting, finance, and pedagogy journals and secured grant funding of over \$1.5 million to date from various sources.

Streeter also serves as program director for the Financial Planning/Wealth Management concentration, which is a registered program with the CFP Board. To extend the students' learning experiences, she supports them as Oversight professor with the Society for Financial Education and Professional Development (SFEPD) and a Certified IRS Tax Preparer on Howard's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Team. In addition, Streeter is a member of the Financial Planning Association (FPA) with a new student club known as "Howard Wealth Advisors" that will connect with FPA and serve the community along with local financial advisors to continue Howard's legacy of "truth and service."
