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She has lived and traveled extensively throughout southern Africa, completed a Fulbright Fellowship in 2012 at the Centre for the Study of HIV and AIDS at the University of Botswana, and has been a visiting scholar at the University of Cape Town and the University of the Western Cape. In 2019 she was awarded a National Endowment for the Humanities fellowship to conduct research for her upcoming book on the “Howard School” and early African American scholars in the field of International Relations. She completed a fellowship with the Drescher Center for the Humanities at the University of Maryland Baltimore County in 2021. She was also awarded a Carnegie African Diaspora Fellowship for 2021 in partnership with the Institute of Pan-African Thought and Conversation at the University of Johannesburg.
